

TN DRIVER'S LICENSE for movers from **OUT-OF-STATE**

If you do not have a Tennessee Driver's License, you have **30 days** to obtain it.
If you don't do that, and are stopped for a traffic violation, you could get a traffic ticket!

To get a Tennessee DRIVER'S LICENSE:

FIRST, go online* to fill out an application and schedule an appointment
(using online 'e-Ticket') at a **FULL SERVICE** Driver's Testing Center to get a new TN license:

www.tn.gov/safety/driver-services/online.html

The closest **FULL SERVICE DRIVERS TESTING CENTERS** to Lenoir City are:

Maryville (southeast off Hwy 321) **865-981-2359** (open 8:30am-5pm)

and **Rockwood** (west off I-40) **865-717-7609** (usually less busy).

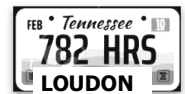
***If you don't have a computer**, just go in with **originals** (no copies): 1) proof of US citizenship;
2) 2 proofs of **CURRENT TN residency** (no PO Boxes); & your social security card.

SECOND, bring the documents and go to the assigned Driver's Service Center to **have your picture taken** for your new 8-year driver's license and to take a simple vision test at the counter.
(It usually runs around \$30.) When you receive your license, check it for any errors before leaving.



TN VEHICLE REGISTRATION & TN LICENSE PLATE (TAG):

Go to the **Loudon County Courthouse Annex** at 101 Mulberry St, Loudon, TN 37774
(just over the bridge, w/green roof) and **bring the necessary documents** listed at:
www.loudoncountyclerk.org/ Their phone number is **865-458-2726** and hours are 8am-4:30
pm Mon-Fri. *After-school hours and the 1st & last days of the month are the busiest time.*
The **drive-thru** window is only for **RENEWALS**, not for new tags.



This is **NOT** official--it's **NOT** a government document. This is just my understanding of the Tennessee Driver's Handbook, the website <http://www.tn.gov> and the responses of local officials who have patiently answered my questions. ALREADY have a TN Driver's License but changed your address?



DRIVERS LICENSE (NECESSARY) Change of Address

If you have moved to a new address that is **not** on your TN Driver's License, you have **10 days**
to change your address with the Department of Safety and Homeland Security.

If you don't, and are stopped for a traffic violation, **you will probably get a ticket!**

INSTRUCTIONS to CHANGE YOUR ADDRESS:

Go online to **www.tn.gov** and click on '**Driver Services**' (twice) and change your address with the Dept. of Safety and Homeland Security. If you do not yet have a REAL ID, you will need to present the same documents needed for a new license www.tn.gov/safety/driver-services.html
If you already have a REAL ID, there is no charge to change the address—unless you order a **new** Driver's License—but print out a **Confirmation** to keep in your vehicle in case you are pulled over.

If you are unsuccessful online or would like a Driver's License with your new address & picture, (for a fee) go to a **Driver Services Division** of the Dept. of Safety and Homeland Security (the closest is DOWNSTAIRS in the **Loudon County Courthouse Annex** at 101 Mulberry Street, Loudon (just over the bridge on the left, w/green roof). Open 8am-4pm Mon-Fri, **865-458-2916**.

Commercial Driver Licenses (CDLs) must be updated at a **FULL-service Driver's Service Center**—see: **www.tn.gov**

VEHICLE REGISTRATION & TAG: AFTER you get your Driver's License address changed, if you are from **another county in TN**, go to the **Courthouse Annex** (UPSTAIRS), **bring the necessary documents** listed at: **www.loudoncountyclerk.org/** and apply for a '**LOUDON**' sticker for your TN License Plate—to put over your other county sticker.
